Description:

ARIS is an open-source, easy-to-use platform for creating and playing augmented reality experiences on iOS devices.

Key Features:

- Allows the user to create mobile games, interactive stories, scavenger hunts, tours and data collection
- Players can complete quests, collect items, and talk to virtual characters, all while exploring the world around them
- **Platform:** iOS/iPadOS (iPhone/iPad)

Civilizations AR



Description:

Puts history, art and culture directly in the user's hand.

Key Features:

- Personal, virtual collection contains over 30 historic artifacts
- Collaboration among 30 museums across the UK
- The user moves, scales and rotates the collection to become an explorer

Description:
